MID-MICHIGAN RAILROAD CLUB SAFETY RULES AND REGULATIONS

SECTION 1: BOILER SAFETY / ENGINES

- 1. A yearly State of Michigan boiler inspection shall be completed on any boiler to be operated at Mid-Michigan.
- 2. Boiler certificate must be of the current year, provided the state is conducting inspections for the current year.
- 3. Safety chains or proper drawbar to be used between engine tender and all cars, at all times when the Public is riding. A knuckle coupler is not a proper draw-bar.

SECTION 2: OPERATIVE SAFETY RULES / PASSENGERS

- 1. All passengers must sign insurance waiver and have hand stamp.
- 2. Passengers will be loaded and unloaded at designated station only.
- 3. Passengers shall always be seated facing forward. Arms and legs shall be kept inside cars when train is in motion. Passengers shall be advised of this prior to departure.

SECTION 3: OPERATIVE SAFETY RULES / TRAINS

- 1. All engines must be run at a safe speed and under complete control at all times. A brisk walk is a good way to judge the maximum speed when carrying the general public.
- 2. All engines shall be run at reduced speed and prepared to stop short of obstructions in areas of congestion or limited sight.
- 3. All engines will operate at a reduced speed when crossing bridges.
- 4. A train stopped other than at a station will, when possible; send out a flagman at a reasonable distance to the rear.
- 5. Trains operating on public run days will be required to have either:
 - a. A conductor/brakeman seated in a position to observe the passengers and easily communicate with the engineer. By setting backward in the front most seat or, if using radios, in the rear most seat.
 - b. In lieu of a conductor, all engineers on trains not staffed with a conductor must carry a FRS radio that they are able to hear and understand while the train is in operation.
- 6. Mainline switches must be returned to normal position and points checked after use. *Exception*, remote controlled switches may be left in the reverse positron.
- 7. Relief engineers must be thoroughly briefed on the individual engine he / she is to operate. A complete understanding of the engine and safety rules must be made.

Anyone who has consumed alcoholic beverages will not be permitted to operate trains and/or support the operations of the Mid-Michigan Railroad Club. PLEASE DON'T DRINK AND DRIVE.

The safety committee and club officers reserve the right to restrict anyone from activities on the Mid-Michigan railroad if he/she violates any of these safety regulations.
